

Terrorist attacks across four continents

26 February 1993 **New York.** Bomb at the World Trade Centre. Six killed, more than 1,000 injured.

7 August 1998 **East Africa.** Bombs at three US embassies kill 224 and injure 5,000 (largely Africans).

11 September 2001 **New York.** Planes flown into the Twin Towers kill 2948 and injure thousands more.

12 October 2002 **Bali.** Bombs in beach resort kill 202 and injure many others.

28 November 2002 **Mombasa.** Bomb in Israeli-owned hotel kills 16.

12 May 2003 **Riyadh.** Suicide bombers kill 34 in attack on housing compounds for expatriates.

15 and 20 November 2003 **Istanbul.** Bombs outside synagogue and at bank and British Consulate kill 55.

11 March 2004 **Madrid.** Bomb attacks at stations kill 191 and leave 1,463 injured.

7 July 2005 **London.** Bombs on three underground trains and a bus kill over 50 and injure hundreds. (A second similar attack on 21 July caused further disruption but no deaths when bombs failed to explode.)

23 July 2005 **Sharm el-Sheikh, Egypt.** Three car bombs in holiday resort kill over 60 .

11 July 2006 **Mumbai, India.** Train bombings kill 209.

Note: Also numerous bombings and other attacks in Iraq, Afghanistan and Pakistan. Many other planned attacks were foiled, such as that on Glasgow Airport in 2007.
